1 S b.w. (v) F (j) = dge

In a one syllable b.w. after a short vowel sound, the final (j) sound is spelled dge

(C), (VV), (V) F (j) = ge

After a consonant, 2 vowels or a long vowel sound, the final (j) sound is spelled ge

### BOOK 4 - LESSON 64

F (o) = ow

The final long (o) sound is spelled ow

F (u) = ue

The final long (u) sound is spelled ue

### BOOK 4 - LESSON 65

F [sh](u)(n) = [tion]

The final (shun) sound is spelled tion

### BOOK 4 – LESSON 66

F [(zh)(u)(n)] = [sion]

The final (zhun) sound is spelled sion

F (u) = ue

### BOOK 4 – LESSON 70

1S b.w. (v) F (s) = s

In a 2 syllable b.w. after a short vowel in the *un*accented syllable, the final (s) sound is spelled s

### BOOK 4 – LESSON 71

(V) F (s) = ce

After a long vowel sound, the final (s) is spelled ce as in mice

### BOOK 5 – LESSON 78

(V) '(C)(V)

In a 2 syllable b.w., the final long vowel in the first syllable is spelled with a vowel.

### BOOK 5 – LESSON 82

2 S b.w. (V) F (s)' = ss

In a 2 syllable base word, after a short vowel sound in an accented syllable, the final (s) sound is spelled ss

### Lesson 82 cont.

(VV)F(s) = se

After 2 adjacent vowels, the final (s) is spelled se as in moose

(C)F (s) = se

After a consonant sound, the final(s) is spelled s as in dogs

### BOOK 5 – LESSON 94

(v)'\*(C)(l)=VC\*CLE

When you hear a short vowel sound before a final stable, the consonant must be doubled in the final stable syllable as in juggle
